Approval of Minutes from November 6, 2019

Old Business

- Wine Education Courses
 - All courses have been entered and launched in CurriQnet
- Italian Scholarship – Recipients on Hold
 - Due to Covid-19, this year's study abroad trip to Italy has been postponed. The plan is to send the recipients with next years group.
- Food Service Renovation
 - Looks like this will not happen in regards to culinary arts involvement. The Danner committee has recommended changes though.

Program Updates

- On Line Instruction- Lecture/ Lab
 - It has been a difficult transition from in-class instruction to online learning. Classes had a high rate of "excused withdrawals".
- Fundraising for Scholarship- Feast at the Fox
 - Unfortunately, due to Covid-19, the Feast at the Fox and the Winter Feast have been cancelled this year.
 - Alternative ways of fundraising were discussed and included ideas about hosting silent auctions and a mailing campaign.

New Business

- Wine Program Certificates (stackable) and degrees
 - The Wine Program and Certificate Degree courses have been launched and approved.
 - There was discussion about graphic design, direct to consumer marketing and video/video editing being incorporated into the curriculum.
 - Do we move forward on Degree and Certificates in Wine Studies? Call for motion. Motion was moved by Dolores, seconded by Britney, and passed.
- Front of House Certificate – Motion to approve certificate. Motion was moved by Dolores, seconded by Justin, and passed.
- Hospitality Program Transfer Curriculum
 - There is some tweaking that needs to be done for the Hospitality Program Transfer (see details listed below)
 - Cul Art 1 Intro needs to be 3-units
 - Cul Art 029 Hosp Management needs to be 3-units
 - Combine Cul Art 004, Culinary Math and 013 Purchasing to a 3-unit course (degree track)
 - Create a 1-unit Culinary Math Class (certificate track)
 - Call for motion. Motion was moved by Justin, seconded by Britney, and passed.
- State of the State and future VTEA CTE funding budgets
- CTE Funding received 2019-20
 - Large pieces of equipment were purchased.
- CTE Funding request 2020-21
 - The application for funding has been submitted.
- Core indicators
 - Discuss and develop plan for 20-21 indicators
- Look and different solutions to develop high quality on line courses to help in retention of culinary students. Our students are tactile learners and on line is difficult for them.
- Review course prerequisites and co-requisites*
- Course requisites had been adjusted for courses 7,8,5 and 9 last year. We will review in the fall when faculty are back from summer break.
- Fall Schedule
 - At this time, the plan for Fall 2020 may be to send pre-prepped food home with students who will prepare dishes for evaluation.
 - Cul Arts 19 will be offered three days a week, but not Cul Arts 09.
 - There will be no Artisan Bakery or Student Chef in Fall 2020.
