

Labor Market Analysis: 1261.00/Community Health Care Worker

The Los Angeles Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (LA COE) prepared this report to provide regional labor market supply and demand data related to three middle-skill occupations:

- Health Education Specialists (21-1091) Provide and manage health education programs that help individuals, families, and their communities maximize and maintain healthy lifestyles. Use data to identify community needs prior to planning, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating programs designed to encourage healthy lifestyles, policies, and environments. May link health systems, health providers, insurers, and patients to address individual and population health needs. May serve as resource to assist individuals, other health professionals, or the community, and may administer fiscal resources for health education programs.¹
- Social and Human Service Assistants (21-1093) Assist other social and human service providers in providing client services in a wide variety of fields, such as psychology, rehabilitation, or social work, including support for families. May assist clients in identifying and obtaining available benefits and social and community services. May assist social workers with developing, organizing, and conducting programs to prevent and resolve problems relevant to substance abuse, human relationships, rehabilitation, or dependent care.²
- **Community Health Workers (21-1094)** Promote health within a community by assisting individuals to adopt healthy behaviors. Serve as an advocate for the health needs of individuals by assisting community residents in effectively communicating with healthcare providers or social service agencies. Act as liaison or advocate and implement programs that promote, maintain, and improve individual and overall community health. May deliver

health-related preventive services such as blood pressure, glaucoma, and hearing screenings. May collect data to help identify community health needs.³

Middle-skill occupations typically require some postsecondary education, but less than a bachelor's degree.⁴ Although *health education specialists* typically require a bachelor's degree, they are considered middle-skill because approximately one-third of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with the relevant occupations.

Based on the available data, there appears to be a supply gap for these middle-skill community health occupations in the region. Furthermore, entry-level wages exceed the self-sufficiency standard wage in Los Angeles County, and more than one-third of current workers in the field have completed some college/associate degree or less education. Therefore, due to all of the criteria being met, the LA COE endorses this proposed program. Detailed reasons include:

Demand:

- Supply Gap Criteria Over the next five years, 4,224 jobs are projected to be available annually in the region due to new job growth and replacements, which is more than the three-year average of 1,193 awards conferred by educational institutions in the region.
- Living Wage Criteria Within Los Angeles County, all three occupations have entrylevel wages <u>above</u> the self-sufficiency standard hourly wage (\$18.10/hour).⁵
- Educational Criteria Within the greater LA/OC region, 93% of the annual job openings for occupations related to community health typically require a high school diploma or equivalent.
 - However, the national-level educational attainment data indicates between 39% and 50% of workers in the field have completed some college/associate degree or less education.

Supply:

• There are **19 community colleges** in the greater LA/OC region that issue awards related to community health, conferring an average of **612 awards annually** between 2019 and 2022.

Between 2019 and 2021, there was an average of 581 awards conferred annually in related training programs by non-community college institutions throughout the greater LA/OC region.

Occupational Demand

Exhibit 1 shows the five-year occupational demand projections for these middle-skill community health occupations. In the greater Los Angeles/Orange County region, the number of jobs related to these occupations is projected to increase by 15% through 2026. There will be more than 4,200 job openings per year through 2027 due to job growth and replacements.

Wages

The labor market endorsement in this report considers the entry-level hourly wages for these middle-skill community health occupations in Los Angeles County as they relate to the county's selfsufficiency standard wage. Orange County wages are included below in order to provide a complete analysis of the greater LA/OC region. Detailed wage information, by county, is included in Appendix A.

Los Angeles County

All three occupations have entry-level wages above the self-sufficiency standard wage for one adult (\$18.10 in Los Angeles County). Typical entry-level hourly wages are in a range between \$18.29 and \$19.26. Experienced workers can expect to earn wages between \$27.76 and \$49.91.


Orange County

The majority (92%) of annual openings for these middle-skill community health occupations have entry-level wages <u>below</u> the self-sufficiency standard wage for one adult (\$20.63 in Orange County). Typical entry-level hourly wages are in a range between \$17.33 and \$22.05. One occupation in this report has entry-level wages above the county's self-sufficiency standard wage: health education specialists (\$22.05). Experienced workers can expect to earn wages between \$26.32 and \$48.45, which are higher than the self-sufficiency standard.

On average, the entry-level earnings for the occupations in this report are \$19.92; this is above the living wage for one single adult in Los Angeles County (\$18.10). Exhibit 4 shows the average wage for the occupations in this report, from entry-level to experienced workers.

Job Postings

There were 3,540 online job postings related to middle-skill community health occupations listed in the past 12 months. Exhibit 5 displays the number of job postings by occupation. The majority of job postings (48%) were for social and human service assistants, followed by health education specialists (44%) and community health workers (8%). The highest number of job postings were for clinical educators, care coordinators, lactation consultants, health educators, and outreach

specialists. The top skills were social work, nursing, mental health, case management, and bilingual skills (Spanish/English). The top three employers, by number of job postings, in the region were: West Coast University, Kaiser Permanente, and University of California.

Educational Attainment

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists the following typical entry-level education levels for the occupations in this report:

- Bachelor's degree: Health education specialists
- High school diploma or equivalent: Social and human service assistants; community health workers

In the greater LA/OC region, the majority of annual job openings (93%) typically require a high school diploma or equivalent. However, the national-level educational attainment data indicates between 39% and 50% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. Of the 72% of middle-skill community health job postings listing a minimum education requirement in the greater Los Angeles/Orange County region, 39% (1,001) requested high school or vocational training, 11% (289) requested an associate degree, and 49% (1,259) requested a bachelor's degree.

Educational Supply

Community College Supply

Exhibit 6 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in programs that have historically trained for the occupations of interest. The colleges with the most completions in the region are Mt. San Antonio, Long Beach, and Santa Ana.

Non-Community College Supply

For a comprehensive regional supply analysis, it is important to consider the supply from other institutions in the region that provide training programs for community health occupations. Exhibit 7 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by these institutions in relevant programs. Due to different data collection periods, the most recent three-year period of available data is from 2019 to 2021. Between 2019 and 2021, non-community college institutions in the region conferred an average of 581 bachelor's and sub-baccalaureate awards. Bachelor's awards are included because *health education specialists* typically require a bachelor's degree as the entry-level education. Sub-baccalaureate awards include associate degrees, postsecondary awards, and other academic awards.



*The average percentage of workers age 55 and older across all occupations in the greater LA/OC region is 27%. These occupations have a slightly smaller share of older workers, which typically indicates fewer replacements needs to offset the amount of impending retirements.
