



Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Parks and Tree Services Occupations Merritt College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

April 2023

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an “undersupply” of Parks and Tree Services workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region (Alameda, Contra Costa counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 394 students in the Bay region and 95 students in the East Bay Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0109.00 - Horticulture programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Merritt College and in the region.

This report profiles Parks and Tree Services Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a proposed new Oakland Public Works Parks and Tree Services, Level 1 program at Merritt College.

- **First-Line Supervisors of Landscaping, Lawn Service, and Groundskeeping Workers (37-1012):** Directly supervise and coordinate activities of workers engaged in landscaping or groundskeeping activities. Work may involve reviewing contracts to ascertain service, machine, and workforce requirements; answering inquiries from potential customers regarding methods, material, and price ranges; and preparing estimates according to labor, material, and machine costs.

Training Requirement: NA
Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 30%
- **Pesticide Handlers, Sprayers, and Applicators, Vegetation (37-3012):** Mix or apply pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, or insecticides through sprays, dusts, vapors, soil incorporation, or chemical application on trees, shrubs, lawns, or botanical crops. Usually requires specific training and State or Federal certification. Excludes “Commercial Pilots” (53-2012) who dust or spray crops from aircraft.

Educational Supply

There are eight (8) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 60 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2019-20) on TOP 0109.00 - Horticulture. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there are three (3) community colleges that issued 16 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay region with 454 annual openings for the Parks and Tree Services occupational cluster and 60 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 394 students. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 111 annual openings and 16 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 95 students.
