

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Real Estate Salesperson Occupations West Valley College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research October 2022

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Real Estate Salesperson workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the Silicon Valley sub-region (Santa Clara county). There is a projected annual gap of about 1,156 students in the Bay region and 296 students in the Silicon Valley Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0511.00 Real Estate programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at West Valley College and in the region.

This report profiles Real Estate Salesperson Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the Silicon Valley subregion for a Real Estate Salesperson License regional program recommendation at West Valley College.

- **Real Estate Sales Agents (41-9022):** Rent, buy, or sell property for clients. Perform duties, such as study property listings, interview prospective clients, accompany clients to property site, discuss conditions of sale, and draw up real estate contracts. Includes agents who represent buyer.
 - Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 37%

Educational Supply

There are 12 community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 165 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 0511.00 Real Estate. In the Silicon Valley Sub-Region, there is one (1) community college that issued four (4) awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 1,321 annual openings for the Real Estate Salesperson License occupational cluster and 165 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,156 students. In the Silicon Valley Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 300 annual openings and four (4) annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 296 students.

Occupations for this report were identified by use of skills listed in O*Net descriptions and job descriptions in Burning Glass. Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
