II. Advisory Committee Highlights and Recommendations from Previous Meeting on 10/03/2018

- A. Summary of Last Meeting Recommendations
 - 1. Narcan training should incorporate the NarcanNow APP. Focus on pushing plunger hard for training.
 - 2. Committee supported acquisition of MDI Trainers and LMA/King Airways for demonstration.
 - 3. Committee approved acquisition of a Medical Advisor
 - a) Update Dr. Beena Kazi of CHOC has agreed to represent OCC as the Medical Advisor
 - 4. Approved Name Changes for OCC EMS Program and removal of English prerequisite
 - a) Vicki Sweet commented that Academia should increase focus on teaching clear and effective documentation to improve new hire documentation skills.
 - 5. Approved ratification of OCC EMS 150 PLO
 - 6. Committee approved textbook adoption should be at discretion of the Individual EMT Program
 - 7. Industry states weakness of new hire skills include documentation, patient interview and IV bag preparation.
 - 8. Committee approved request for funding for
 - a) AHA compliant Mankins
 - b) new ambulance or repair
 - c) updated training videos
 - d) medication trainers
 - 9. APP for NREMT preparation
 - a) Current recommendations: FISdap Product

- 10. Comments from industry on new potential outcomes or goals
 - a) Work on writing V. Sweet expressed concern at previous meeting due to removal of English prerequisite because of poor documentation
- 11. Program recruitment suggestions
 - a) (previous meeting) Care pre-app while they are waiting for NREMT

 - a) (Previous Meeting) New Book at discretion of program

III. Current Program Status and Updates

- A. Enrollment Trends
 - 1. Increasing in all classes- Holding Steady at 54 max students per semester.
 - a) Inquiry The number of students per semester in neighboring program
 (1) West Coast EMT estimates about 600 students a year
 - (2) SAC estimates about 300 students per year
 - (3) OCC estimates about 108 students per year
 - b) Request Committee Approval to increase population cap at OCC
 - (1) OCC requested a motion to expand population cap above 54 students.
 - (a) No motion.
 - (b) V. Sweet of OCEMS noted that there is difficulty obtaining clinical shifts for the current local volume of students as there is.
 - (i) The room had a general consensus of agreement to this.
 - (ii) J. Wagoner of Lynch mentioned that they are servicing 8 schools currently
 - (iii) J. Melendrez stated Care was next to full as well
 - 2. 24 Hour refresher- Low for OCC
 - a) Consensus was low enrollment due to extensive availability of classes
 - b) SAC reported that many of their refresher students are alumni
- B. Facilities/Equipment
 - 1. OCC in search of drivable retired ambulance.
 - a) Industry noted Liberty was retiring 9 ambulances this year
 - b) OCFA mentioned that they may have options as well.
 - (1) Committee has provided previous support to fund ambulance (see minutes)
- C. Curriculum
 - 1. APP for NREMT preparation
 - a) Request for feedback from academia on useful product
 - (1) P. Dibb recommended EMT Review Plus
 - (2) M. Horan recommended EMT Prep
 - (3) There were some comments that this program had poor user reviews, but it does have powerful tools for teachers.
 - 2. Total Semester hours
 - a) Inquiry Total Semester Hours of Neighboring Programs
 - b) OCC Hours 180 hours in class
 - (1) 96 Traditional Hours
 - (2) 84 lab hours

- (3) Hybrid online Hours vary
 - (a) West Coast estimates 184 hours+ online
 - (b) SAC estimates 208+ online
- c) OCC requests committee approval to increase traditional lecture hours.
 - (1) Motion by P. Dibb
 - (2) Second by M. Horan
 - (3) Motion Passed
- D. Student Outcomes: Licensure/Certification Pass Rates and Graduate Employment
 - 1. Last Semester:
 - a) 1^{st} attempt 24/26 = 92%
 - b) all attempts 25/26 = 96%
 - (1) SAC estimates 98% last semester 12/13

IV. Program Improvement Recommendations (Perkins IV) -Beichner

- A. Student skill attainment High, 96%
- B. Student completion Down to 71% Spring 19 from 89% Fall 18
 - 1. V. Sweet noted that students will often enroll and withdrawl after receiving financial aid or Gi Bill monies
 - a) OCC noted that we have steps in place to prevent this.

 - 1. Committee Inquiry Is there a need or supply for supplemental pediatric EMS training?
 - a) General consensus among the committee was that there is always a need for pediatric skills training
 - b) V. Sweet and P. Dibb endorsed the need for additional training classes.
 - 2. Request Committee Approval to Revise EMS 145 to a pediatric first aid course.
 - a) OCC expressed interest in creating a new Pediatric EMS supplemental course for either Medical Professionals or Pediatric Caregivers
 - (1) Motion by V. Sweet
 - (2) Second by P. Gleed
 - (3) Motion Passed
- C. Materials
 - OCC is currently considering change from Mistovish "Pre-Hospital Emergency Care" to "Emergency Care and Transportation of the Sick and Injured" by American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons (AAOS)
 West Coast and Saddleback Enderse the AAOS back
 - a) West Coast and Saddleback Endorse the AAOS book

A. The graduate of the Emergency Medical Services program will be prepared for entry-level employment as a professional and competent Emergency Medical Technician and meet the needs of the local health care community.

 - a) V. Sweet and P. Dibb have information about a practice PCR program that has strong reviews.
 - 2. Open forum for Industry to specify needs from academia:
 - a) Strong consensus on the need for improvement in documentation, medical terminology and spelling.
 - b) C. Jack emphasized poor spelling and poor use of medical terminology. Suggested a focus on spelling and terminology.
 - (1) B. Beichner suggested the incorporation of medical terminology exams through the course.

 - (3) Motion Passed
 - b) Recommended ACCDs Lucas or Auto-pulse
- C. Program recruitment suggestions
 - 1. Inquiry Any other companies implementing a pre-app system
 - 2. No other companies have implemented a pre-app system and care is reworking theirs.
