RECOMMENDATIONS FROM ADVISORS:

- 1. Continue to modernize the studio and post-production facilities; upgrading of camera equipment, classroom technology and industry-standard editing software is mandatory.
- 2. Increase industry partnerships, sponsorships, guild relationships and mentorships to form career pathways.
- 3. Increase internship opportunities and soft skills training through work-based learning, such as our *Cinema Cooperative Education Program*.
- 4. Job Skills and Career plan development, including awareness of Social Media, Brand Development and Marketing. Create pathways for meeting agents and acquiring representation for Directors and Writers.
- 5. Advanced skill training in Post Production, Color Correction, Remote Workflow and offer Certifications in Avid Media Composer and Avid Pro Tools.
- 6. Explore developing curriculum based on remote workflow, live streaming, virtual and augmented reality.
- Prepare students for remote work environments, online conferencing etiquette, and how to build your network, develop skills and expand career opportunities while sheltering in place during CO-VID 19.

COMMENTS FROM ADVISORS:

The individual production based model that is at the heart of LACC's Dept. of Cinema-TV Program as well as the Cinema programs at other colleges and universities is the best approach to have the film student become self reliant and technically and emotionally capable of being "self-starting" and not wait to be "called" for a job.

The virus issue is just one of many transformations that are compelling film workers in all phases of their careers to adapt to technological and social interaction change.

Emphasizing safety above all should not be a new teaching / learning concept as filmmaking has always had a high degree of physical and social risk, in terms of stability and financial well-being. Now, such knowledge / teaching must include health / safety measures that center on the dangers of the virus and other possible viruses. Instruction in such health concerns should be mandatory as instruction in other safety production concerns.

Today young social influencers are making more money than industry professionals doing their own project on their own. This is a viable form of revenue and creative satisfaction.

I think the most important aspect is having a sustainable online option for creative, social and distribution.

How has the COVID-19 "safer at home" period impacted your business and workflow?

It actually gave us time to catch up globally as the video game Industry surged in participation from home.

All shows with live audiences cannot operate at the capacity they used to so many utilities, camera operators and people on the ground do not have work in today's covid era of production.

Which "soft skills" are most important for students seeking entry level work or internships?

Communication skills. Knowing when to talk and not to talk but also how to develop relationships with people whose trust you can earn for future projects down the line. Reliability is key.

Anticipatory skills are extremely important as opposed to task driven directives.

Positivity. Reliability. Computer savvy. Social skills. Proximity to location of project.

Social media savvy, PC Mac, word, excel, slack and an interest in video games industry.

How should we integrate social media in our marketing and in our classes?

Prob the most important piece of marketing you can do is utilizing social - insta, tiktok, snap, voutube, FB.

Considering kids are your #1 target you should go heavily into social media promotion. All of these kids have their heads in their phones and tablets. You gotta get in there and show them what you offer.

Offer classes in Twitch, YouTube, IGTV and even Tik Tok as those are legitimate forms of revenue and gaining brand awareness.

More courses directed around the video games Industry might be very attractive - it's beyond tv, film, music combined. Augmented Reality Graphics

Continuing the discussion from previous years about which video editing software to teach: Final Cut Pro® X vs. Avid™ vs. Adobe™ Premiere® vs. DaVinci Resolve™. Any suggestions on Virtual/Augmented Reality?

All of the above.

Avid & Premiere are the two most used editing softwares in my industry. Mostly Avid for big multi-cam shows with multiple editors tapped into the system. Premiere for stand-alone edits being delivered complete.

Adobe Premiere has just dominated in terms of tv - it should be required

Avid Media Composer Certification allows students to stand out in a sea of resumes of budding editors. Teaching the skills of this workflow and allowing students to pursue certification is an invaluable training tool.

I think this is a great idea. I bought a Oculus Quest recently and it blew my mind away. As rigs like the Quest become more affordable, the audiences will get bigger and more content will need to be created in this space.
