Unanimous consent for a need for a social media certificate was given, with several social media professionals in attendance citing that the rapid job growth in the area and that social media was becoming prevalent in all areas covered in the Media Arts department.

Several members provided input to avenues for the new course Media Arts 117 (Introduction to Social Media) and Journalism 109 (Critical Thinking and Media Literacy) and, as well as suggestions add to existing classes to make sure the certificate allowed someone to be job ready for areas that include social media.

SUGGESTIONS:

JENNY LAKE — Need to understand social media in a SMALL ENVIRONMENT — not just LARGE interfacing. Need to be able to communicate with specific audience with specific issues.

Important that students need to be able to put a story into 140 characters. (**FOR Journalism 101 - Create an exercise that requires students to do this)**

Important to teach how to seek out new outlets. Help students identify news places to participate in social media.

CATHERINE CLINCH – Students need to know how to do a DEEP DIVE into issues. Students can use phone for all of their work.

Challenge is that you are teaching classes that are taught in other degrees. But, at the end of the day, there is no individualism. Not seeing anything on here that is social media specific.

MADISON – Need to teach students "flexibility" and be able to change with changes in the industry/APPS.

BOBBI – Project: Find a new platform, emerging new software...go learn it and return with a project using this. EVERYONE will come in with NEW platforms.

Also, before they compete certificate

STEPHANIE – Consider adding DIRECTED STUDY – "Go get a job" – doing social media work for some company - as an elective for the students that are into it.

Title for the class – Intro to Social Media is boring. Need to change the title to: Social Media Now – HOW TO USE "SOCIAL MEDIA for your future"

CODING SKILLS? Consensus - Don't really need it.

NEED: Bring in guest speakers in Social Media class.
