

Program Endorsement Brief: 2105.00/Administration of Justice Administration of Justice Certificate of Achievement

Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence, October 2018

Summary:

The Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE) prepared this report to provide regional labor market supply and demand data related to administration of justice. This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with relevant occupations.

The following summarizes key findings from this data brief:

- The number of jobs for administration of justice-related occupations is projected to increase by 5% over the next five years. Nearly 3,000 job openings will be available annually due to new job growth and replacement need (e.g. retirements).
- Over the past 12 months, there have been 1,143 online postings for administration of justice-related jobs in Los Angeles and Orange Counties.
- In the region, 25 colleges have programs closely related to administration of justice.
- Between 2014 and 2017, community colleges in the region conferred an average of 2,454 awards (associate degrees and certificates) in related training programs.

Occupational Demand—In Los Angeles/Orange County, the number of jobs for administration of justice-related occupations is projected to increase by 5%. There will be nearly 3,000 job openings per year through 2022 (Exhibit 1).

¹ Five-year change represents new job additions to the workforce. Annual openings include new jobs and replacement jobs that result from retirements and separations.

Wages—Entry-level hourly wages for administration of justice-related positions in the region are between \$18.81 and \$39.95, respectively. Entry-level wages are higher than the MIT Living hourly wage for one adult in the region (\$13.54 in Los Angeles County, \$15.31 in Orange County).

Job Postings—There were 1,143 online job postings related to administration of justice listed in the past 12 months. The majority of job postings are for: police officers, public safety officers, and investigators. Top specialized skills are: public health and safety, prevention of criminal activity, and surveillance The top three employers, by number of job postings, in the region are: Allied Universal Corporation, City of Glendale, and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

Educational Attainment—The BLS lists a high school diploma or equivalent as the typical entry-level education for the occupations. The national-level educational attainment data indicates between 32% and 52% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. Of job postings listing a minimum education requirement in Los Angeles/Orange County, 95% requested high school or vocational training.

Community College Supply—Appendix A shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in the related TOP codes: Administration of Justice (2105.00), Corrections (2105.10), and Police Academy (2105.50). The college/program with the most completions in the region is: East LA College/Administration of Justice. Between January and September 2018, there were four other community college requests for data related to a similar program.
