

Program Endorsement Brief: 3020.20/Piloting Aircraft Dispatcher

Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence, October 2018

Summary:

The Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE) prepared this report to provide regional labor market supply and demand data related to aircraft dispatcher. This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with relevant occupations.

The following summarizes key findings from this data brief:

- The number of jobs for dispatchers and airfield operations specialists is projected to increase by 2% over the next five years. More than 800 job openings will be available annually due to new job growth and replacement need (e.g. retirements).
- Over the past 12 months, there were 735 online job postings related to the two occupations of interest in Los Angeles/Orange County.
- In the region, four colleges have piloting and air traffic control programs.
- Between 2014 and 2017, community colleges in the region conferred an average of 119 awards (associate degrees and certificates) in related training programs.

Occupational Demand—In Los Angeles/Orange County, the number of jobs for dispatchers and airfield operations specialists is projected to increase by 2%. There will be more than 800 job openings per year through 2022 (Exhibit 1).

Wages—Entry-level hourly wages for dispatchers and airfield operations specialists in the region are between \$11.35 and \$16.72. Entry-level wages for airfield operations specialists are higher than the MIT Living Hourly Wage for one adult in the region (\$13.54 in Los Angeles County, \$15.31 in Orange County). Experienced workers earn between \$30.16 and \$53.89, which is higher than the living wage.

¹ Five-year change represents new job additions to the workforce. Annual openings include new jobs and replacement jobs that result from retirements and separations.

Job Postings—There were 735 online job postings related to dispatchers and airfield operations specialists listed in the past 12 months. The majority of job postings are for dispatchers, and airport dispatchers. Top specialized skills are: scheduling, customer service, and data entry. The top three employers, by number of job postings, in the region are: Ultimate Air Shuttle, First Transit, and MV Transportation, Inc.

Educational Attainment—The BLS lists a high school diploma or equivalent as the typical entry-level education for these occupations. The national-level educational attainment data indicates that approximately half of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. Of job postings that included a minimum education requirement in Los Angeles/Orange County, all request at least a high school diploma or vocational training.

Community College Supply—Appendix A shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in the related TOP codes: Piloting (3020.20) and Air Traffic Control (3020.30). The college with the most completions in the region is Mt. San Antonio. Between January and September 2018, there were no other community college requests for data related to a similar program.
