

# Labor Market Information Report Construction Management Occupations Laney College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

January 2023

#### Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Construction Management workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region (Alameda, Contra Costa counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 1,833 students in the Bay region and 550 students in the East Bay Sub-Region.

#### Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0957.00 Civil and Construction Management Technology programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Laney College and in the region.

This report profiles Construction Management Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a college/district program review at Laney College.

Construction Managers (11-9021): Plan, direct, or coordinate, usually through subordinate supervisory
personnel, activities concerned with the construction and maintenance of structures, facilities, and systems.
Participate in the conceptual development of a construction project and oversee its organization, scheduling,
budgeting, and implementation. Includes managers in specialized construction fields, such as carpentry or
plumbing.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 33%

Helpers-Carpenters (47-3012): Help carpenters by performing duties requiring less skill. Duties include using, supplying or holding materials or tools, and cleaning work area and equipment. Construction laborers who do not primarily assist carpenters are classified under "Construction Laborers" (47-2061). Apprentice workers are classified with the appropriate skilled construction trade occupation (47-2011 through 47-2231).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: No formal educational credential

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 25%

Construction and Building Inspectors (47-4011): Inspect structures using engineering skills to determine structural soundness and compliance with specifications, building codes, and other regulations. Inspections may be general in nature or may be limited to a specific area, such as electrical systems or plumbing.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training
Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 46%

# **Educational Supply**

There are five (5) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 93 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2019-20) on TOP 0957.00 Civil and Construction Management Technology. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there are two (2) community colleges that issued 18 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There is one (1) four-year institution in the Bay Region and East Bay Sub-Region issuing 20 Bachelor's degrees on average annually (last 3 years ending 2019-20) on CIP 52.2001- Construction Management, General.

# **Gap Analysis**

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 1,946 annual openings for the Construction Management occupational cluster and 113 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,833 students. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 588 annual openings and 38 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 550 students.
