Re: Program endorsement request for Basic Law Enforcement Academy

## **Background**

American River College requested a program endorsement request for occupations related to the basic peace officer academy, Level 1 program.

The COE recently provided an extensive report on public safety occupations to Woodland Community College that contained the relevant labor market information. American River College should include that report along with the present memo for the regional consortium application.

## **Findings**

- The 3-county region surrounding Woodland Community College outperformed the wider Sacramento region for police and sheriffs patrol officers, registering an increase of 80 officers over the ten-year period. The wider region saw a slight decline for the same occupation between 2007 and 2017, from 5,800 jobs to 5,400 jobs.
- Police and sheriff's patrol officers are expected to have nearly 400 annual openings for the 9-county region (the 7-County Sacramento region, plus Colusa and Lake counties).
- The median wages for police and sheriff's patrol officers are \$46 per hour for the wider 9-county Sacramento region.
- Awards data shows just 80 average annual awards for the Sacramento region from the program
  category associated with Police Academy (TOP 21-0510). The lion's share of public safety-related
  awards, hundreds annually, come from completions of Administration of Justice. The present memo and
  report for Woodland Community College did not investigate the required education and training that
  specifically qualifies candidates for police and sheriffs.

#### **Recommendations**

- The award production for Police Academy is dwarfed by the projected annual openings for police and sheriff's patrol officers.
- The COE recommends that ARC move forward with the proposed program due to the apparent supply gap, and the strong wages associated with police and sheriff's patrol officers.
