

## Landscaping Occupations Labor Market Information Report Monterey Peninsula College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research November 2020

### Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an undersupply of Landscaping workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, and Santa Cruz Counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 14,830 students in the Bay region and 8,039 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

### Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0109.00-Horticulture programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Monterey Peninsula College and in the region.

This report profiles Landscaping Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey subregion for a proposed new set of certificates at Monterey Peninsula College: Landscape Irrigation, Landscape Pest Management, and Tree Care Specialist. <u>This LMI report can be used for all three</u> <u>certificates when submitting to BACCC's Program Recommendation process, because the TOP code and</u> <u>the SOC codes are the exact same for all three certificates.</u>

Labor market information (LMI) is not available at the eight-digit SOC Code level for Nursery Workers (45-2092.01), therefore, the data shown in Tables 1 and 2 is for Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop, Nursery, and Greenhouse (at the six digit SOC level) and likely overstates demand for Nursery Workers. Tables 3, 4, 6, 9, 10 and 11 use job postings data from Burning Glass at the eight-digit SOC Code level for Nursery Workers (45-2092.01).

• Landscaping and Groundskeeping Workers (37-3011): Landscape or maintain grounds of property using hand or power tools or equipment. Workers typically perform a variety of tasks, which may include any combination of the following: sod laying, mowing, trimming, planting, watering, fertilizing, digging, raking, sprinkler installation, and installation of mortarless segmental concrete masonry wall units. Excludes "Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop, Nursery, and Greenhouse" (45-2092).

• Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop, Nursery, and Greenhouse (45-2092): Manually plant, cultivate, and harvest vegetables, fruits, nuts, horticultural specialties, and field crops. Use hand tools, such as shovels, trowels, hoes, tampers, pruning hooks, shears, and knives. Duties may

include tilling soil and applying fertilizers; transplanting, weeding, thinning, or pruning crops; applying pesticides; or cleaning, grading, sorting, packing, and loading harvested products. May construct trellises, repair fences and farm buildings, or participate in irrigation activities. Excludes "Graders and Sorters, Agricultural Products" (45-2041) and "Forest, Conservation, and Logging Workers" (45-4011 through 45-4029).

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 14%

### **Educational Supply**

There are eight (8) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 60 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 0109.00-Horticulture. There are two (2) colleges in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region issuing 20 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

## Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 14,890 annual openings for the Landscaping occupational cluster and 60 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 14,830 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 8,059 annual openings and 20 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 8,039 students.

Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
