

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Music Production Occupations Cabrillo College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research June 2022

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Music Production workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, Santa Cruz counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 521 students in the Bay region and 33 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 1005.00 Commercial Music programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Cabrillo College and in the region.

This report profiles Music Production Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for a Regional program recommendation for Cabrillo College.

 Music Directors and Composers (27-2041): Conduct, direct, plan, and lead instrumental or vocal performances by musical groups, such as orchestras, bands, choirs, and glee clubs. Includes arrangers, composers, choral directors, and orchestrators.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 18%

Broadcast Announcers and Radio Disc Jockeys (27-3011): Speak or read from scripted materials, such as news
reports or commercial messages, on radio or television. May announce artist or title of performance, identify
station, or interview guests. Excludes "Broadcast News Analysts" (27-3021).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 32%

Audio and Video Technicians (27-4011): Set up, or set up and operate audio and video equipment including
microphones, sound speakers, video screens, projectors, video monitors, recording equipment, connecting wires and
cables, sound and mixing boards, and related electronic equipment for concerts, sports events, meetings and
conventions, presentations, and news conferences. May also set up and operate associated spotlights and other
custom lighting systems. Excludes "Sound Engineering Technicians" (27-4014).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Postsecondary nondegree award

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training
Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 39%

• Sound Engineering Technicians (27-4014): Operate machines and equipment to record, synchronize, mix, or reproduce music, voices, or sound effects in sporting arenas, theater productions, recording studios, or movie and video productions.

Educational Supply

There are six (6) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 84 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 1005.00 Commercial Music. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is one (1) community college (Cabrillo) that issued three (3) awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There are four (4) other CTE educational institutions in the Bay Region issuing 70 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2016-17) on TOP 1005.00 Commercial Music. There are no other CTE educational institutions in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region issuing awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 675 annual openings for the Music Production occupational cluster and 154 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 521 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 36 annual openings and 3 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 33 students.

Occupations for this report were identified by use of skills listed in O*Net descriptions and job descriptions in Burning Glass. Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
