

Labor Market Information Report Arboriculture Occupations Cabrillo College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research February 2022

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Arboriculture workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, Santa Cruz counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 5,979 students in the Bay region and 999 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0109.10 Landscape Design and Maintenance programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Cabrillo College and in the region.

This report profiles Arboriculture Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for a program modification at Cabrillo College.

• First-Line Supervisors of Landscaping, Lawn Service, and Groundskeeping Workers (37-1012): Directly supervise and coordinate activities of workers engaged in landscaping or groundskeeping activities. Work may involve reviewing contracts to ascertain service, machine, and workforce requirements; answering inquiries from potential customers regarding methods, material, and price ranges; and preparing estimates according to labor, material, and machine costs.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 30%

Landscaping and Groundskeeping Workers (37-3011): Landscape or maintain grounds of property using hand
or power tools or equipment. Workers typically perform a variety of tasks, which may include any combination of
the following: sod laying, mowing, trimming, planting, watering, fertilizing, digging, raking, sprinkler installation,
and installation of mortarless segmental concrete masonry wall units. Excludes "Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop,
Nursery, and Greenhouse" (45-2092).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: No formal educational credential

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 20%

Pesticide Handlers, Sprayers, and Applicators, Vegetation (37-3012): Mix or apply pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, or insecticides through sprays, dusts, vapors, soil incorporation, or chemical application on trees, shrubs, lawns, or botanical crops. Usually requires specific training and State or Federal certification. Excludes "Commercial Pilots" (53-2012) who dust or spray crops from aircraft.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 21%

Educational Supply

There are seven (7) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 70 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 0109.10 Landscape Design and Maintenance. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is one (1) community college (Cabrillo) that issued 8 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 6,049 annual openings for the Arboriculture occupational cluster and 70 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 5,979 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 1,007 annual openings and 8 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 999 students.

Occupations for this report were identified by use of skills listed in O*Net descriptions and job descriptions in Burning Glass. Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
