

# Business Information Worker Level II Occupations Labor Market Information Report Cabrillo College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research August 2020

#### Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be a significant undersupply of Business Information Worker Level II workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, and Santa Cruz Counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 18,684 students in the Bay region and 1,187 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

This report also provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0514.00-Office Technology/Office Computer Applications programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Cabrillo College and in the region.

#### Introduction

This report profiles Business Information Worker Level II Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for state chaptering of an existing low unit, local certificate at Cabrillo College.

Payroll and Timekeeping Clerks (43-3051): Compile and record employee time and payroll data. May
compute employees' time worked, production, and commission. May compute and post wages and deductions,
or prepare paychecks. Excludes "Bookkeeping, Accounting, and Auditing Clerks" (43-3031).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 48%

Office Clerks, General (43-9061): Perform duties too varied and diverse to be classified in any specific office
clerical occupation, requiring knowledge of office systems and procedures. Clerical duties may be assigned in
accordance with the office procedures of individual establishments and may include a combination of
answering telephones, bookkeeping, typing or word processing, stenography, office machine operation, and
filing.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 44%

• Secretaries and Administrative Assistants, Except Legal, Medical, and Executive (43-6014): Perform routine clerical and administrative functions such as drafting correspondence, scheduling appointments, organizing and maintaining paper and electronic files, or providing information to callers. Excludes legal, medical, and executive secretaries (43-6011 through 43-6013).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 47%

• Insurance Claims and Policy Processing Clerks (43-9041): Process new insurance policies, modifications to existing policies, and claims forms. Obtain information from policyholders to verify the accuracy and

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completeness of information on claims forms, applications and related documents, and company records. Update existing policies and company records to reflect changes requested by policyholders and insurance company representatives. Excludes "Claims Adjusters, Examiners, and Investigators" (13-1031).

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 45%

 Procurement Clerks (43-3061): Compile information and records to draw up purchase orders for procurement of materials and services.

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 34%

# **Educational Supply**

There are 21 community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 209 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 0514.00-Office Technology/Office Computer Applications. There are two colleges in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region issuing 49 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There are six (6) Other Educational Institutions in the Bay Region issuing 152 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2016-17) on TOP 0514.00-Office Technology/Office Computer Applications. There are two Other Educational Institutions in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region issuing 61 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

# **Gap Analysis**

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 19,045 annual openings for the Business Information Worker Level II occupational cluster and 361 annual (3-year average) awards from community colleges and Other Educational Institutions for an annual undersupply of 18,684 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 1,297 annual openings and 110 annual (3-year average) awards from community colleges and Other Educational Institutions for an annual undersupply of 1,187 students.
