Interview clients, review records, and confer with other professionals to evaluate individuals` mental and physical condition and to determine their suitability for participation in a specific program. Plan or implement follow-up or aftercare programs for clients to be discharged from treatment

programs.
Assess individuals` degree of drug dependency by collecting and analyzing urine samples.
