

Program Endorsement Brief: 0514.20 – Medical Office Technology Medical Administrative Assistant

The Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE) prepared this report to provide Los Angeles/Orange County regional labor market supply and demand data related to two middle-skill occupations: medical assistants (31-9092); and medical secretaries and administrative assistants (43-6013). Middle-skill occupations typically require some postsecondary education, but less than a bachelor's degree. This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with the relevant occupations.

Based on the available data, there appears to be a supply gap for the two occupations of interest in the region. In addition to more than half of incumbent workers having completed an associate degree or some college, half also have entry-level wages that exceed the living wage in Los Angeles County. Therefore, due to all the criteria being met, the COE endorses this proposed program. Detailed reasons include:

Demand:

Supply Gap Criteria – Over the next five years, there is projected to be nearly 7,500 jobs available annually in the region due to new job growth and replacements, which is more than the 4,131 awards conferred annually by educational institutions in the region.

¹ The COE classifies middle-skill jobs as the following:

[•] All occupations that require an educational requirement of some college, associate degree or apprenticeship;

All occupations that require a bachelor's degree, but also have more than one-third of their
existing labor force with an educational attainment of some college or associate degree; or

All occupations that require a high school diploma or equivalent or no formal education, but also require short- to long-term on-the-job training where multiple community colleges have existing programs.

- Living Wage Criteria In Los Angeles County, the majority (50.4%) of annual job openings for the two occupations have entry-level wages above the county's living wage (\$15.04/hour).²
- Educational Criteria Within the LA/OC region, 50.1% of the annual job openings for the two occupations typically require a high school diploma.
 - National-level educational attainment data indicates between 54% and 63% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree.

Supply:

- Between 2017 and 2020, 16 community colleges in the LA/OC region offered programs that have historically trained for the two occupations of interest, conferring an average of 629 awards annually between 2017 and 2020.
- Between 2016 and 2019, there was an average of 3,502 awards conferred annually in related training programs by non-community college institutions throughout the region.

Occupational Demand

Exhibit 1 shows the five-year occupational demand projections for the two occupations of interest. In Los Angeles/Orange County, the number of jobs related to these occupations is projected to increase by 4% through 2024. There will be nearly 7,500 job openings per year through 2024 due to job growth and replacements.

This report includes employment projection data by Emsi, which uses EDD information. Emsi's projections are modeled on recorded (historical) employment figures and incorporate several underlying assumptions, including the assumption that the economy, during the projection period, will be at approximately full employment. To the extent that a recession or labor shock, such as the economic effects of COVID-19, can cause long-term structural change, it may impact the projections. At this time, it is not possible to quantify the impact of COVID-19 on projections of industry and occupational employment. Therefore, the projections included in this report do not take the impacts of COVID-19 into account.

³ Five-year change represents new job additions to the workforce. Annual openings include new jobs and replacement jobs that result from retirements and separations.

Wages

The labor market endorsement in this report considers the entry-level hourly wages for the two occupations in Los Angeles County, as they relate to the county's living wage. Orange County wages are included below in order to provide a complete analysis of the LA/OC region. Detailed wage information, by county, is included in Appendix A.

Los Angeles County — More than half of the job openings for these occupations have entry-level wages <u>above</u> the living wage for one adult (\$15.04 in Los Angeles County). Typical entry-level hourly wages are in a range between \$14.44 and \$16.72. Experienced workers can expect to earn wages between \$21.27 and \$23.94, which are higher than the living wage estimate.

Orange County — Both of the occupations studied in this report have entry-level wages <u>below</u> the living wage for one adult (\$17.36 in Orange County). Typical entry-level hourly wages are in a range between \$14.66 and \$16.96. Experienced workers can expect to earn wages between \$21.60 and \$24.28, which are higher than the living wage estimate.

Job Postings

Over the past 12 months, there have been 24,942 online job postings for the two occupations of interest. Of these 24,942 job postings, 46% were for medical assistants (11,413 job postings); 39% for medical secretaries (9,796); and 15% for patient representatives (3,733), an emerging occupation. The highest number of job postings were for medical assistants, medical receptionists, front desk receptionists, dental receptionists and dental front office. The top skills were scheduling, appointment setting, front office, customer service, and administrative support. The top employers, by number of job postings, in the region were PIH Health, Optum, and University of California.

It is important to note that the job postings data included in this section reflects online job postings listed in the past 12 months and does not yet demonstrate the impact of COVID-19. While employers have generally posted fewer online job postings since the beginning of the pandemic, the long-term effects are currently unknown.

Educational Attainment

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists a postsecondary non-degree award as the typical entry-level education for *medical assistants* and a high school diploma or equivalent for *medical secretaries and administrative assistants*. In the LA/OC region, the majority of annual job openings (50.1%) typically require a high school diploma. National-level educational attainment data indicates that between 54% and 63% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree.

Of the 55% job postings listing a minimum education requirement in Los Angeles/Orange County, 97% (13,271) requested a high school diploma and 3% (373) requested an associate degree.

Educational Supply

Community College Supply — Exhibit 2 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in the related TOP codes: Medical Office Technology (0514.20); Medical Assisting (1208.00); Clinical Medical Assisting (1208.10); and Administrative Medical Assisting (1208.20). The colleges with the most completions in the region are Santa Ana, North Orange Adult, and Saddleback. Over the past 12 months, there were three other related program recommendation requests from regional community colleges.

Non-Community College Supply — For a comprehensive regional supply analysis, it is also important to consider the supply from other institutions in the region that provide relevant training programs. Exhibit 3 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred in programs crosswalked to TOP that have historically trained for the two occupations of interest. Due to different data collection periods, the most recent three-year period of available data is from 2016 to 2019. Between 2016 and 2019, non-community college institutions in the region conferred an average of 3,502 awards annually in related training programs.
